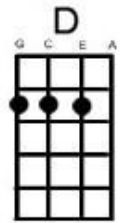


Introducing the D chord

1. Stack your index, middle and ring finger on the G, C, E strings at the second fret
2. Or use the middle finger only at the 2nd fret across the G, C, E strings, make sure to curve the finger enough so to miss the A string.

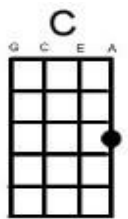


Leaving on a Jet Plane

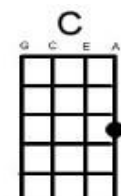
VERSE 1

I hate to wake you up to say good- bye



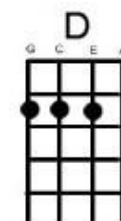
VERSE 2
